

JLY BOARD MEETING MINUTES

- → Susan Coyne opened up the Zoom meeting shortly after 7 pm.
- → There were 3 resignations, one last week by letter, and 2 at this meeting in person. Resignations were accepted by the current Board of Directors present at this meeting. Steve Cain, Vice President, Jessica Kahanek Cain, Treasurer, and Joe Hoyt, Hospitality and Growers Group has resigned. Director position, will be filled by Lou Lou.
- → Susan made a motion to nominate Lou Lou and Tracey seconded that motion. She will be an asset to our club as she has previously been involved in other nonprofit organization boards and has website experience. She is a current regular volunteer at the greenhouse.
- → Vice President position, Brian Shelton expressed interest and feels that he can perform the functions of VP. He was voted in as the interim VP. Treasurer position: Melanie is interested in this role and will be voted at August 3rd meeting.
- → Steve and Jessica will return all society property (physical and intellectual) to Denise.
- → Greenhouse update is that many of the plants that were damaged by the heat are starting to recover, new growth and new spikes. This year the SABG will be doing some upgrades to the greenhouse. They will be adding a new shade cloth, water wall, and new pads.
- → There may not be a show for 2023. The weekend SABG has offered is during Austin's Heart of Texas Orchid Society Show. We avoid having shows during the same weekend as nearby societies due to vendor availability and AOS judging. We asked the San Antonio Botanical Garden to sponsor an orchid sale/vendor fair in fall of 2023. The Garden Center charges \$800 per day and an additional \$15 per hour for an event.
- → The San Antonio Zoo has expressed interest in our society in keeping a collection of orchids and displaying some orchids there. Brian Shelton will be heading up this project.
- → Our August 3rd meeting, Tom Dunlap will be giving a presentation on Angraecums. Our circuit speaker canceled so he will give a combined society Zoom presentation Tuesday August 2nd 7 pm. At \$50 per club.
- → There are speakers lined up for October and November, more details to come on this.

SAN ANTONIO BOTANICAL GARDENS & ALAMO ORCHID SOCIETY GREENHOUSE UPDATE

Sadly, the fans and cooling systems were accidentally left off all day on Friday, June 17. Temps soared to 135°F degrees.

The society and SABOT are doing everything to prevent further damage and to save as many plants as possible. These photos document some of the resilient orchid beauty we have seen over the past month.

Many of the plants that were damaged by the heat are starting to recover, new growth and spikes. The San Antonio Botanical Garden will be making some upgrades to the greenhouse later this year.



HOME REMEDIES

From the American Orchid Society

VINEGAR | Rather than expensive and potentially dangerous herbicides, spray full-strength vinegar to kill weeds between pavers and on greenhouse floors. (Do not spray on orchids.) ASPRIN | Just 34 of one 325 mg tablet per gallon of water helps protect plants from fungal and viral pathogens when used as a spray.

HOMEMADE INSECTICIDE | Mix in a 1 gallon [3.8 L] jug: 1 pint (0.5 L) rubbing alcohol, 1 pint (0.5 L) 409 spray cleaner, and 3 quarts (2.8 L) of water. Apply as a spray.

ISOPROPYL (RUBBING ALCOHOL) | Put into an empty spray bottle and use to treat scale, mealybugs, thrips, aphids, red spider mites, and perhaps other pests. It works only while wet and must contact the insect.

NEOSPORIN | Has been reportedly used to treat orchid crown rot; remove rotted area of plant before treatment.
