

Members are invited to tour the society / SABOT greenhouse to learn more about growing, maintaining, potting/mounting orchids. Volunteers will help facilitate this event. Bring water and dress for a hot environment (we recommend sunscreen, a hat, and light clothes).



MONTHLY CHECKLIST FOR MAY & JUNE

Cattleya - Summerblooming types are showing buds on growing, soft pseudo-bulbs (and may need potting, as signaled by deterior-ating mix.) Plants will be brittle and may be in bud. Unless potted now, they may not root later, as this type tends to be seasonal in its rooting behavior. Stake lead growth to avoid breakage. They will be entering a period of rapid growth, and have not built up momentum to be slowed by your missing a day or two of watering. It is safer to err on the dry side than on the wet. Too much shade will cause rapidly developing inflorescences to droop unattractively.

Phalaenopsis - Except for the latest-spiking plants, all should be ready for potting or already potted. These are seasonal in rooting behavior. The critical point for potting is when new roots emerge from the base. Once seen, begin regular watering and fertilizing to maximize on their growth this season.

Paphiopedilum -

Maudiae types will be well into their season, but do not stake too soon. This will develop nodding flowers that do not face the observer. Allow the flowers to ripen naturally, then support the spike right below the ovary for best display. The multi-floral types will be entering their most active growth phase,

so lots of light, water & fertilizer are called for to mature their large growths.
